



## Rose Cottage Glenbuchat

*Cairngorms National Park, Scotland*

### **LOCATION**

#### **Travelling from the Aberdeen area**

Take A944 from Aberdeen via Westhill, Dunecht, Alford, Bridge of Alford and at Mossat, turn left on to A97 direction Strathdon.

Keep on the A97 for about 5.5 miles, passing through Kildrummy and Glenkindie, and look out for sign for Glenbuchat at Bridge of Buchat.

Take a right turn on to the unclassified road at that point and continue on a single track road for 1.4 miles to a fork in the road - take the left hand road



towards **Glenbuchat hall** and follow this road for the Cottage.

About 0.5 mile along this road keep right at a junction which has a road going off to the left to a place marked Kirkton of Glenbuchat. Continue on the road for about another 0.5 mile to a point where there is a building on right hand side called Old shop (which is just past a former church) and is just before Glenbuchat hall (which is on the left hand side).



Turn right into the (shared) single track private road and follow it uphill for about 300 metres to Rose Cottage. You will pass two houses on the right hand side, and one on the left, before arriving at a sharp right hand bend (at this point there is another white painted cottage on the left hand side) - follow the road round this bend and, about 50 metres farther on, you will find Rose Cottage.

### **Travelling from the south via Braemar**

If travelling via Braemar (using the A93 over Glenshee) continue on the A93 towards Crathie. Look out for the sign for Tomintoul - take a left turn on to the B976 signposted Tomintoul and follow this fairly steep and narrow road over the hill and then down to Glenshiel lodge where you should take a left turn on to A939 direction Tomintoul and follow this road until it reaches a T junction with the A939 and A944. At this junction turn right on to A944 (direction Strathdon and Aberdeen). Follow this main road (for about 6 miles) passing through Bellabeg after which (less than a mile farther on) look for a fairly inconspicuous road sign for "Glenbuchat" (see photo)



At that junction, take a left turn into the unclassified single track road and follow this road (up and over a hill) into Glenbuchat and, at a T junction (with Glenbuchat Hall on your right), turn right and then follow the road for about 50

metres as far as the Old Shop - see above photo (in description for directions from Aberdeen area).

At the junction outside of the Old Shop, turn left into the narrow single track road and proceed uphill for about 300 metres to Rose Cottage. Driving along this track you will pass two houses on the right hand side, and one on the left, before arriving at a sharp right hand bend (at this point there is a white painted cottage - Weaver's cottage - on the left hand side) - follow the road round this bend and, about 50 metres farther on, you will find Rose Cottage.
